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Description of the 2024 IAIE VIRTUAL Conference Subthemes:

Optimizing Human Potential

- "Human potential, though not always apparent, is there waiting to be discovered and invited forth" (Purkey, 1991). Educators and parents always face a challenge optimizing potential by encouraging good study habits, learning performance, and decent living to optimize potential. Invitational Education (IE) provides a strong and sound theory and practices to support the day-to-day interactions with our children to unleash their true potential despite conflicting educational and parental beliefs. Metaphorically, IE introduces the fertilizer (ICORT) to the school's soil (5Ps) to sow and harvest each child's full bounty. As advocates of IE, we have globally witnessed countless examples of this wonderful human development being optimized. We invite you to share your great examples of IE practices!

Enhancing Health and Wellness:

Research or evidence-based practices will be highlighted in these presentations. Specifically, sessions may address how health and wellness initiatives benefit all stakeholders involved with the institution's five IE domains: people, places, policies, programs, and processes, which can influence student and staff resilience; provide strategies for developing caring, respectful, and trustworthy relationships; develop an agreed upon way of communicating feelings and needs without judgment or blame; implement Tier 1 and 2 interventions in the classroom for the benefit of all students; or reduce the number of student referrals to school mental health staff, etc.

Inviting Inclusivity by Respecting Cultural Assets

Cultural relevance and responsiveness is based on the student's culture, community, and family. Such aspects of students' worldview are referred to as assets (Moll, González, & Amanti, 2009; Roe, 2019). The extent to which teachers respect students' assets is termed Funds of Knowledge. To increase students' sense that they are a part of the classroom community, it is recommended that teachers learn about students' families, community, and culture. Therefore, the student's assets (Funds of Identify) contribute to the teacher's Funds of Knowledge that can be demonstrated through an I-CORT mindset, thereby optimizing the school's 5Ps. This conference subtheme invites presentations that exhibit how respect for student assets not only creates a climate resulting in improved academic success but also intentionally invites culturally diverse learners to attain their fullest human potential (Purkey & Novak, 2016).

Demonstrating an I-CORT Mindset to Sustain Success:

Advocates for Invitational Education theory and practice know that an intentional, caring, optimistic, respectful, and trustworthy (ICORT) mindset (Purkey, Novak, & Fritz, 2020; Anderson, 2021) is crucial for fostering an inclusive and supportive learning environment. When educators adopt such a mindset, they create a positive atmosphere that encourages optimal student engagement and success, particularly for learners with diverse needs. This conference subtheme provides the opportunity to further explore how an ICORT mindset can positively impact learners within an inclusive classroom.
